And the other of said lists of votes shall be kept up by the Presiding Officer, and directed to the Secretary of the County, and within ten days after said Election Meeting said Presiding Officer shall cause the same to be deposited in the Post-Office in said town, or, if there be none, in the Post-Office in an adjoining town, for transmission by mail, and it shall be the duty of the Secretary of this State to furnish the necessary blank returns to the several towns.  
The Presiding Officers are requested to enclose all the lists of votes which are required to be transmitted by mail, in one common envelope (provided for their use, directed to the Secretary of State, sealed, postage paid).
