And the other of said lists of votes shall be sent up by the Presiding Officer, and directed to the Secretary of the State, and within ten days after each Election Meeting said Presiding Officer shall cause the same to be deposited in the Post-Office in said town, or, if there be none, in the Post-Office in an adjoining town, for transmission by mail, and it shall be the duty of the Secretary of the State to furnish the necessary blank returns to the several towns.
The Presiding Officers are requested to enclose all the lists of votes which are required to be transmitted by mail, in one common envelope (carefully forwarded for their use, directed to the Secretary of State, sealed postage paid).
