Gentlemen:

I am inclined to think that the canvassers are to determine whether there has been a failure to elect a judge of Probate in any district by reason of two or more candidates having an equal and the highest number of votes; and that for this purpose they have the right to determine whether a ballot formally defective in respect to the full name of a candidate has a reasonable certainty of designation and was actually cast and intended for that candidate.
